Mob Museum

Spending all this time in quarantine, I have watched a lot of TV, and one area in particular that has caught my fascination is crime stories involving the Mafia. The Mafia traditionally refers to Sicillian organized crime syndicates that are powerful in Sicily and southern Italy. The Mob is a slang term used to refer to organized crime in general, but usually means the most powerful groups, not street gangs or small operations. The Mob Museum is located in Las Vegas, Nevada and provides all the dirt, all in one place!

The Museum provides an eye-opening, authentic view of organized crime's effect on the world and popular culture and reveals an inside look into the events and people of the continuing battle between the Mob and law enforcement. Historical stories are brought to life with intriguing, multisensory displays, hundreds of artifacts and unique perspectives from those directly involved in both sides of the conflict. The Museum opened on Valentine's Day, Feb. 14, 2012. The opening coordinated with the anniversary of the 1929 St. Valentine's Day Massacre in Chicago when seven of Bugs Moran's henchmen were lined up along the brick wall of a warehouse, shot and killed by Al Capone's gang.

The museum offers virtual access where visitors can explore all four floors and learn about the origins of organized crime in America, the early days of Las Vegas, the impact of Prohibition on society, the Kefauver Hearings, ongoing organized crime groups and rackets around the world and more. http://prohibition.themobmuseum.org/

The Godfather focuses on the powerful Italian-American crime family of Don Vito Corleone (played by Marlon Brando). When the don's youngest son, Michael (Al Pacino), reluctantly joins the Mafia, he becomes entrenched in the irresistible cadence of violence and deception. Although Michael tries to maintain a normal marriage with his wife Kay (played by Diane Keaton), he is drawn more and more into the family business. The film came out in 1972 and won 3 Academy awards, including best picture. Dialogue from the movie—especially the line "I'll make him an offer he can't refuse"—became ingrained in pop culture vocabulary, and scenes from the film are often quoted in other movies and TV shows.

Hula Hooping

Hula hooping is a fun way to burn calories and body fat, improve your balance, strengthen your core muscles and boost your cardiovascular fitness. It is said the term "hula hoop" came from British sailors who had seen hula dancing in the Hawaiian Islands and thought it looked similar to the movements of hooping back home. Hooping was again popular in England in the 1800s where children would roll hoops with a stick or rotate the hoop around their waist. The hula hoop gained international popularity in the late 1950s when a plastic version was successfully marketed by California's Wham-O toy company. An estimated 25 million hula hoops were sold in its first four months of production alone.

Benefits of Hula-Hooping

Burns As Much Fat as Treadmill Workouts

According to the American Council on exercise, hula-hooping can burn over 400 calories per hour. You can burn even more calories if you add in arms movements or weights.

Can Replace Ab Workouts

In addition to burning belly fat, you will also tone the muscles of your midsection including abs, obliques, hips and lower back.

Strengthens Your Heart

Fifteen to 30 minutes a day of any exercise strengthens your heart muscles and allows your heart to pump blood throughout your body more efficiently. In turn, this allows your heart to beat faster and also lowers your blood pressure.

Works Out Your Brain

Hula-hooping can be very similar to meditation, surprisingly. The rocking and rhythm cause relaxation and cause deep breathing. The repetitive motion is smooth. Also, it takes a certain level of concentration to hula-hooping, training your mind as well.

Hula-Hooping Tips For Beginners

After watching members of my family try to hula-hoop I realized it might not come as easily to everyone else as it did to me. (As I noticed when my brother-in-law gave it a go.) So here are a few tips I've found that worked if you're just starting out.

- 1. Find the right hoop. The larger the hoop, the easier it will be to spin. Find one that comes up to your belly button when you stand it up straight.
- 2. Wear tighter fitting clothes. Yoga pants are not necessary, but you also don't want to wear anything flowy that can get caught in the hoop.
- 3. Try standing legs shoulder-width apart, with one foot

almost a foot in front of the other

- 4. KEEP YOUR BACK STRAIGHT. No bending over here or you will lose control.
- 5. Hold the hula hoop on each side, making sure it is level If not level, you will automatically lose control of the rhythm.
- 6. Rest the hula hoop against your back and rock it back and forth a few times to "wind up" then spin it towards whichever way feels most natural.
- 7. A good spin should be able to go around your waist a few times with little to no effort from the rest of your body. But after it goes around once, start "rocking" your hips back and forth. This is a basic form of hula-hooping that most anyone should be able to try.
- 8. Keep an even, steady rhythm and you can literally go forever.

Battle of the Burgers

Summer is not summer without a good burger so why not make it a juicy lucy! A Jucy Lucy or Juicy Lucy is a cheeseburger with cheese inside the meat instead of on top, resulting in a melted core of cheese. Two Minneapolis bars, Matt's Bar and the 5-8 Club, claim to have invented this legendary cheese-stuffed burger and have been battling since the 1950's. The bars have been featured on Travel Channel's "Man vs. Food," and President Barack Obama unofficially chose a side when he stopped in to Matt's for a Jucy Lucy and fries in 2014. People will often stop into both eateries in the same day to compare!

Dispute over who invented the Juicy Lucy comes down to two points: the story of the burger's beginnings and which is the better burger.

On the first point, Matt's Bar (3500 Cedar Av. S.) has a better story.

Back in 1954, a regular customer ordered a cheeseburger, and asked the owner, Matt Bristol, to put the cheese on the inside instead of on top. Bristol obliged, and when the customer bit in and got a face full of molten cheese, he exclaimed, "Wow, that's one Juicy Lucy!" The burger was a hit and landed on the bar's menu—though misspelled as "jucy."

The story at 5-8 Club (5800 Cedar Av. S.) is more vague. The Juicy Lucy "was invented in south Minneapolis in the 1950s," Jill Skogheim, president of the 5-8 restaurants said. But does she know the origin? "Not exactly, no."

As for which one is better, that's up to fans. Both restaurants use a fatty grind of beef, and the grease mixes in with the cheese in the center to create a liquid cheesy, meaty sauce. Both season with nothing more than salt and pepper. Check out the recipe of the week section on how to make a Juicy Lucy!

The Juicy Lucy

Recipe from Pinch of Yum

JUICY LUCY! A delicious hamburger stuffed with molten, bubbly, waterfalling cheese, all piled on a buttery toasted bun with all the fixings. The BEST. This recipe comes from a born and raised Minnesotan.

INGREDIENTS:

Juicy Lucy Ingredients:

- 2 lbs. ground beef
- 2 tablespoons burger seasoning
- 6–12 slices American cheese

Juicy Lucy Extras:

• 6 brioche buns

Toppings: Lettuce, tomato, onion, pickles

Sauces: Ketchup, mustard, mayo


DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Mix the spices into the ground beef. Divide the beef into 6 even sections.
- 2. Form each section into two thin patties (a smaller top patty, and a larger bottom patty). Place 1-2 folded pieces of cheese on the bottom patty, and place the smaller top patty over it, pinching up the edges to seal.
- 3. Grill or pan fry for about 5 minutes, or until cooked to your desired doneness and cheese is melted.
- 4. Let the Juicy Lucys rest for a minute or two. This is essential, otherwise the cheese will be so hot that it will literally come exploding out all over the place.
- Serve on buns with your favorite toppings!


